



# **OLUSTVERE SCHOOL OF SERVICE AND RURAL ECONOMICS**

**ARNOLD PASTAK**

- 1888 - 1906 Estonian Alexander City School
- 1914 - The school started operating in 1914 in the Kõo manor as the Alexander Lower-Agricultural School
- 1920 - In 1920 the school continued in Olustvere under the name Estonian Alexander Agricultural School. School's territory size was 522.76 ha.
- 1 August 1936 - all agricultural schools were under the authority of the Ministry of Education. This was the situation until 1940.
- 1 August 1938 - the school was renamed the Estonian Alexander-agricultural secondary school



- January 1941- the school was renamed Olustvere Agricultural State Farm School
- September 1941 the school was renamed - Olustvere Higher Agricultural school (subordinated to the Ministry of Agriculture)
- 1944 - the school was renamed from the Olustvere Agricultural State Farm School (subordinated to the Ministry of Agriculture)



- 1964 - Connect sohvoos technicians and the school was named Olustvere State Farm School (the land was 3,600 hectares). Subit to the Ministry of Agriculture
- 1992 - the school was named Olustvere higher agricultural college. In February 1994 the school created an educational farm 503 ha of land.
- 1993 - founded in the same house vocational training agency Olustvere Primary School
- 1994 - Eliminate Olustvere Sohvoos
- 1995 - 1997 - PHARE project began to develop vocational education



- 1999 – Moved from under the Ministry of Agriculture to the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Education
- 2000 - the school was renamed Olustvere Service and Rural Economics
- 2006 – Joining with Õisu Food Industry School
- 2007 - Teaching from Õisu was brought over to Olustvere
- 2008 - 2015 school got investments from the EU and Norway






# THE SCHOOL:


