### **DISRUPTED FUTURES 2023:**

#### **International lessons on how schools can best equip students for their working lives**

**OECD conference – May 31st, June 1st, June 2nd, 2023**

Submissions are invited in relation to policy, practice and research relating to the career development of children and young people (primary and secondary education). This free, online conference will take the same format as the inaugural OECD [Disrupted Futures 2021 conference](#) which attracted over 500 participants from around the world.

While papers on all aspects of career guidance and development for young people will be welcomed, submissions will be encouraged particularly with regard to four themes: how guidance can best respond to social inequalities; how guidance systems can best enable progression towards green jobs; how guidance can best be enhanced by the use of digital technologies; and, the design and delivery of career pathway programmes. The conference particularly welcomes research papers that make use of analysis of large datasets.
