Christelle Domingos is the Executive Director of Inovcluster since 2022, a cluster that works as a networking platform for the agrifood sector in the Centro region of Portugal, reinforcing innovation, internationalisation, and the transfer of knowledge and technology activities for SMEs. She promotes InovCluster internationally through the participation in international clustering events and platforms, for example the European Cluster Collaboration Platform.

With experience in managing and promoting business incubators, she is a consultant, trainer, and mentor for several entrepreneurship projects. She is involved in several national and international cooperation projects, for example: INTERREG

POCTEP, INTERREG ATLANTIC, COSME, and Horizon 2020. Together with 20 other European partners, they submitted an application to Horizon 2030 to support the implementation of the mission "A Soil Deal for Europe." This application, called LABS4SOIL, will implement eight soil health living labs. These Living Labs will be located across Europe in areas threatened with soil degradation and where existing initiatives have already emerged from local end-users (land managers, i.e., farmers, foresters, urban land managers), innovators, and researchers.

Christelle is part of the team responsible for developing a roadmap for the decarbonisation of the agri-food industry in Portugal. In addition, she is contributing to the creation of a MOOC for the creation of a new professional profile: the by-products and waste valuation in the agri-food sector expert. This course is already online and free, and it is recognised all over Europe.
