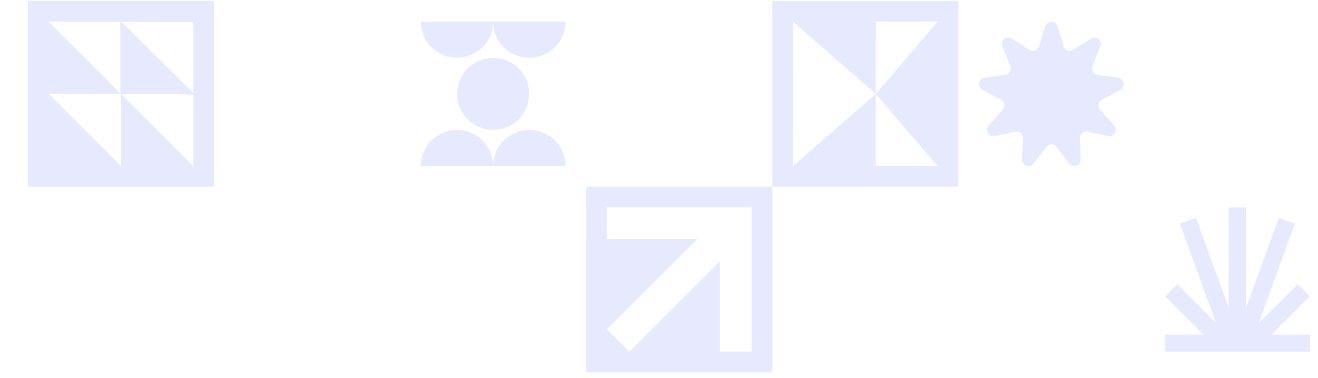
Preparatory year 2021 may – 2022 august august

Our school today in the middle of 3rd year

3rd year

- Only upper secondary education (grades 10-12);
- 486 students (maximum capacity 540);
- 37 staff members;
- We offer a diverse and flexible learning path (through electives and modules), where the student can shape their education according to their interests and future plans;
- Mentorship and a supportive learning environment. Each student has a mentor who helps set goals, maintains motivation, and supports personal development.

Mentor-system in our school

- One mentor group consists of 18 mentees, meaning each class is split in half.
- Mentor sessions take place once a week.
- Three one-on-one meetings with the mentor per academic year.
- Various activities with the mentor group throughout the school year.
- Satisfaction surveys show that over 80% of students were satisfied or very satisfied with the mentor- system.

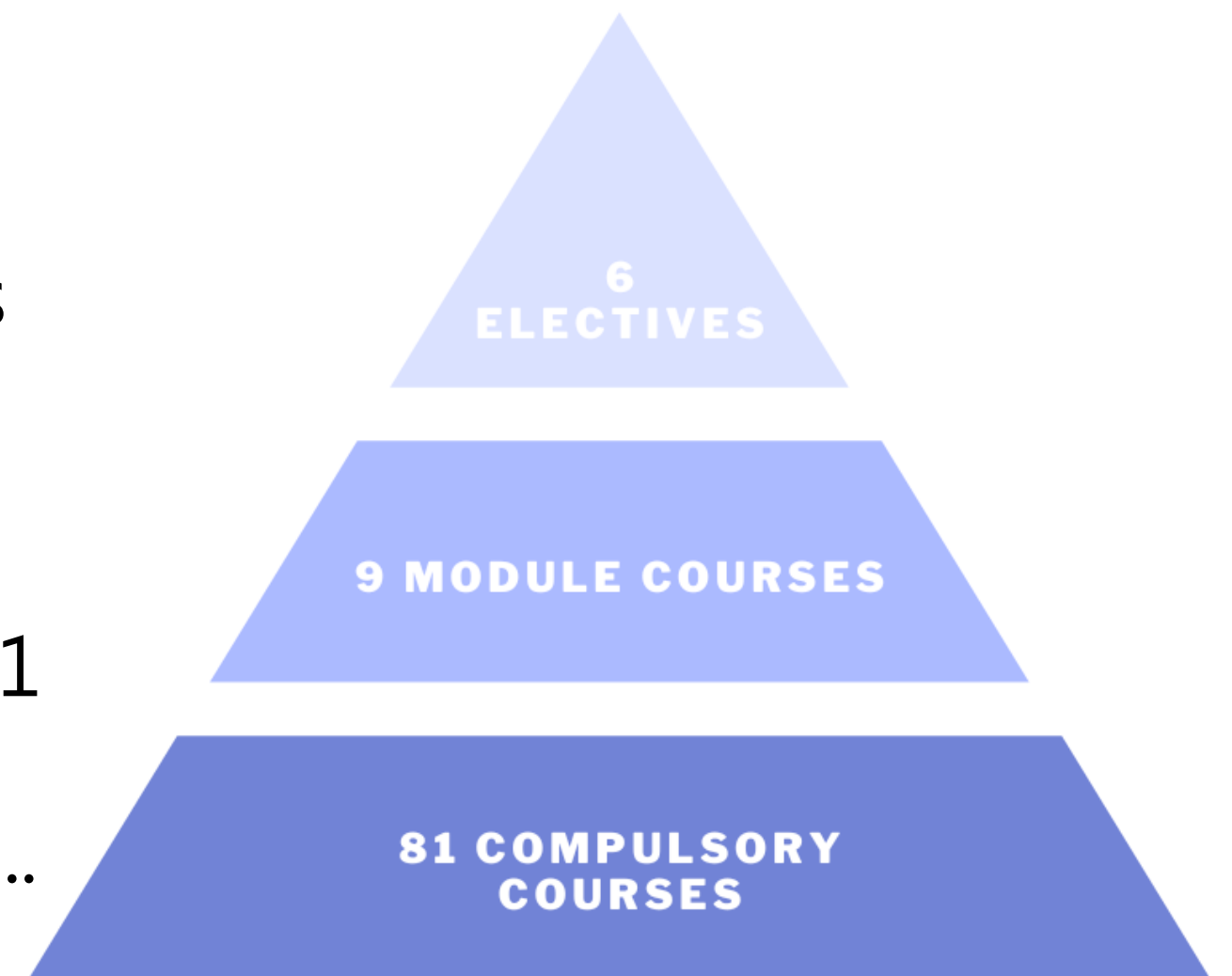

Our curriculum

- 3 years = academic workload is minimum 96 courses (1 course = 21x70min)
- National curriculum = 64 (70 with extensive math) courses are compulsory
- In our school 81 courses are compulsory (Math; Estonian and literature; B2 language = English) Other courses are B1 language= Russian, Finnish or German; physics, biology, chemistry, history, PE, music, social studies, art history etc...
- 6 electives - (psychology, yoga, religion, philosophy, chinese, spanish, 3d modeling, civil law, medicine, podcasting, gesture language, religion, IT, performance skills etc.)
