Core principles of the RED methodology

RED dimensions: contextualization

1. GOVERNANCE

How decisions are taken, how roles are distributed, how decentralisation works during crisis.

2. FINANCING

How resources flow, how budget pressures affect regions, and how spending aligns with national priorities.

3. ACCESS & QUALITY

How students learn amidst displacement, attacks, blackouts, and teacher shortages.

Qualitative work

- Bilateral interviews with key actors
- Consultations and focus groups
- Documentary review

Quality insurance


- Organised workshops
- Regular meetings

Quantitative work

- EMIS datasets,
- National budget and staffing data,
- International repositories such as UNESCO, the World Bank and EU statistical systems,
- Online surveys

Challenges & Mitigation

Key risks


- **Data gaps** remain the largest challenge—high probability, high impact.
- Stakeholder **engagement** delays due to workload and security conditions.
- **Security** constraints that limit physical fieldwork.
- **Political sensitivities** among partners.
- Variability in **expert** performance.



Mitigation

- **Triangulation** of datasets + involvement of the Institute of Education Analytics.
- **Flexible scheduling** and online participation options.
- Reliance on **local experts** and remote data collection.
- Continuous **communication** and transparency.
- **Clear ToRs**, careful selection and close monitoring of experts.
